

## FUN FOAM WINDSOCKS

### Materials:

- fun foam sheets (9X12)
- scissors
- hole punch
- ribbon (1" in a variety of colors and styles)
- yarn
- plastic crafting needles

### Advance Preparation:

Punch holes (approx 2 inches apart) along the long edge of one side of the fun

foam and evenly along the short side edges

### Activity:

1. Cut ribbon into a variety of lengths.
2. Thread craft needle with yarn
3. Poke the needle through the top of a ribbon strip.
4. Thread the yarn (in the ribbon) through a hole in the fun foam
5. Tie the ends of the yarn together.
6. Continue in each hole along the long edge of the fun foam.
7. Match up the holes along the short edges.
8. Tie the two short edges of the fun foam together to form a cylindrical windsock.
9. Use the top hole along the short edge to tie the windsock to the Sukkah.

## Sukkot Lantern

### **Materials:**

2 Large colorful rectangles construction paper  
String  
Scissors  
Stapler  
Pencil

### **Preparation:**

1. Staple the narrow sides of a colorful rectangular construction paper to make a cylinder.
2. Fold the longer sides of another colored rectangular piece of construction paper together so you have 2 rectangles one on top of another.
3. Mark, with a pencil, lines from the bottom of the folded paper to about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the height. Start 2 inches (about 5 centimeters) apart but leave 2 inches (about 5 centimeters) from each side of the paper.
4. Cut along the lines from the bottom of the folded paper. Unfold the paper with the cuts and staple it on the first cylinder. To make the cut fold stand out, keep 2 inches (about 5 centimeter) from the top of the cylinder and 2 inches (about 5 centimeter) from the bottom.
5. Cut long strips of colorful construction paper and staple them at the bottom of the cylinder for tassels.
6. Make 2 holes opposite each other at the top and string a string through them to hang.



## **Sukkah Stars**

Cut a star shape from heavy construction paper or Foam

Punch a hole in the top of the star and decorate with glitter

Cut a piece of fishing line or other strong thread to about one foot in length. Tie one end through the hole in the star and the other to a paperclip. Open the paper clip and use it to attach the thread to the material on your Sukkah's ceiling
